



RADIO BROADCASTING - A LESSON IN SKILL BUILDING





The Premise:

- Serves as the basic foundation of Radio Broadcasting course.
- Students are expected to write a script for radio using evocative language, using sound effects, etc.
- Students learn how to edit using Adobe Audition

STUDENT CHOICE:

 Students have full creative control to deliver their message – topic, tone, mixing voice(s), sound effects, audience, etc.











The Premise:

- Students are tasked with deciding on a type of update (news, sports, entertainment, weather, traffic, technology, political, etc.) that appeals broadly to an audience.
- Research 5 stories from traditional resources, read and summarize those stories down to the major details (to emulate the capsule of an update)
- Students write the summaries into a template provided to them and practice delivering the update (~1-2 minutes in length)
- Finally, the students record the update for broadcast.







 Students have full creative control to deliver their message – topic, tone, stories, audience, etc.











Types:

 Sports, School, Entertainment, Gossip, Politics, "Girl Talk," Advice, Conspiracy Theories, Music, Multi-Lingual/Cultural, Variety.


The Premise:

- Students explore the formats of different types of radio shows individually.
- Form Teams based on interest (2-4 per team)
- Teams collectively design:
 - Format for their show
 - Clock
 - Show Logo
 - Branding Language/PositionerStatement
 - Record/Edit Show Open





The Premise:


 This is a truly LIVE show every 3rd or 4th class period, depending on the number of teams.




